The Shroton History article

The Shroton Parish Magazine September 1896

Shroton Fair was held on Friday and Saturday, the 25th and 26th of September and will be long remembered on account of the terrible stormy weather. On the Friday, such a gale blew that many of the tents and booths were blown down, while on the Saturday rain fell in torrents during the earlier part of the day though it fortunately cleared up a little in the evening. On the whole, however, there was very little business and certainly not much pleasure at this year's fair.

On the Thursday afternoon, in the mothers' meeting room, a welcome tea was given by Lady Baker

to about 150 of the travellers and in the same room where also a school was held by Mr Jacob (Diocese Missioner) on each day of the fair for the travellers' children.

A delicious October recipe from Katherine Davies

A healthy, budget friendly filling Tomato and Lentil Soup as the weather gets colder.



I do hope you enjoy this soup with some toast or a crusty slice of baguette. The lentils are a great addition to soups, providing some protein, and when I blitz it, my very fussy daughter doesn't even realise it's healthy!

1 tbsp vegetable oil

1 medium onion, finely chopped

2 cloves of garlic, crushed

1 large potato, diced to 2cm cubes (keep the skin on for extra fibre)

2 tins of tomatoes (the ones that don't have a ring pull are much cheaper)

2 tsp smoked paprika (optional) or

1 tsp dried oregano (optional)

1/2 tsp chilli powder (or more if you like it hot!)

100g split red lentils

300ml stock (either chicken or vegetable)

salt and pepper to taste

handful of grated cheddar or some feta crumbled

Heat the oil in a large pan over a high heat. Once hot, add the onions and turn the heat to medium and fry until translucent, stirring occasionally so it doesn't brown. Add the garlic and cook for another 3 minutes, still stirring. Add the diced potato and cook for five minutes making sure it doesn't stick to the bottom of the pan. Add the tomatoes, spices, lentils and stock and cook for 30 minutes, or until the potatoes are soft, but still holding their shape.

Now, you can either eat it as it is - I like it with chunks of vegetables - or blitz until smooth using a blender, or a handheld blender in the pan. Add salt and pepper to taste.

To serve, sprinkle a handful of grated cheddar, or some crumbled feta on top.


read with the children at bedtime. A second book will follow and greetings cards are in production.




