#### Incidents reported in the Western Gazette

Accident, 9 March 1866 Shroton.

On Friday last, Mr Crew, smith and Mr Painter, carpenter, were driving in a gig to Fontmell Parva. In driving up Newfield Lane, their horse took fright at a steam thrashing

machine, which was at work between two ricks, started off, overturned the trap, and threw out both the men.

Mr Painter was dragged some distance with his leg in the wheel, but Mr Crew held fast the rains until the horse stopped. Both were injured, the former rather severely about the legs.

The Rev W Maunsell and Mrs Maunsell, who happened to be passing, carried Mr Painter home in their carriage, and otherwise lent valuable assistance. The horse escaped unhurt, but the gig was smashed.

23 June 1865: Ingenious Youths.

A day or two since, five or six boys had the charge of a like number of horses, and were ploughing and dressing a piece of land by Shroton Brake. The youth concocted a plan so that some of them might rest while the others work and so to take it in turns. This was to attach the roller to the harrows and so put the horses together.

This novel plan did not answer long for no sooner did they come to turn than the team of horses became entangled amongst the harrows, and as a natural consequence became exceedingly restless and unmanageable, but fortunately, they were extricated without further damage.

#### Incidents (contd.)

Nothing taught by this experiment, it was next proposed to take two of the horses that had behaved as badly in team and put them to the plough under charge of one of the biggest of the party. When this was done, away they started, the plough after them, haphazard, capsizing Tom Seger, and over hedges and ditches, through crops thick and thin, till they came to a precipice, over which they fell headlong into a sandpit below; but, strange to say, nothing, neither of the horses was injured, and the plough pitching over missed both animals.

After a little repose they renewed their

fright, but were captured at the mouth of the pit, and so released from the perilous position, the venturous youths not a little frightened!








## Farewell to our Ukraine family!

Vika and Vlad, the Ukrainian mother and son the village has been supporting for the past eighteen months, have moved to Weymouth. It's the start of a new adventure for them and we all wish them well.

Whilst they lived in our area, our Shroton support group (consisting of around 25 Shrotonians) donated money to help with their living expenses, entertained them in our houses, kept them supplied with logs, took them out on trips, and ferried Vika up and down from Shaftesbury for her English lessons. It's been great to see their self-confidence grow to the extent that they applied for and got a council house in Weymouth, in a quiet cul-de-sac about a mile and half from the town centre.



They both seemed happy when Anne and I drove down to see them a few Sundays ago. Their two-bedroom house is clean and modern, and they have another Ukraine family for neighbours. We were able to give them what was left of the support group's fighting fund, which amounted to over £250. This will go towards setting up their home and purchasing school uniform.

After a heartening bowl of Borscht – the national dish – we said our goodbyes.

Thanks to everyone who supported them and helped them reach this point on their difficult journey.

#### Wessex Internet makes significant donation to Shroton playpark improvements

Shroton-based internet service provider, Wessex Internet, has donated over £8,000 towards improvements to the playpark in its home village.
